To restrict security assistance to Lebanon, and for other  
purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Countering Hizballah  
5 in Lebanon’s Military Act of 2019”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN LEBANESE**  
2 **ARMED FORCES AND HIZBALLAH.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the  
4 date of the enactment of this Act, the President shall sub-  
5 mit a report to Congress—

6 (1) identifying all military officers, com-  
7 manders, advisors, officials, or other personnel with  
8 significant influence over the policies or activities of  
9 the Lebanese Armed Forces who are members of,  
10 paid by, or significantly influenced by Hizballah; and

11 (2) describing military activities conducted by  
12 the Lebanese Armed Forces to disarm Hizballah  
13 pursuant to United Nations Security Council Resolu-  
14 tion (UNSCR) 1701 (2006).

15 (b) FORM.—The report required by section (a) shall  
16 be submitted in an unclassified form but may have a clas-  
17 sified annex.

18 **SEC. 3. RESTRICTION ON SECURITY ASSISTANCE.**

19 (a) IN GENERAL.—Of the amounts appropriated or  
20 otherwise made available for security assistance for the  
21 Government of Lebanon for a fiscal year, 20 percent may  
22 not be obligated or expended for such purpose until the  
23 President certifies to Congress that—

24 (1) the Lebanese Armed Forces has taken  
25 measurable steps in the last year to limit the influ-

1           ence or expel anyone identified pursuant to section  
2           2(a)(1);

3           (2) the activities described pursuant to section  
4           2(a)(2) demonstrate a serious commitment by the  
5           Lebanese Armed Forces to fulfill its obligation to  
6           disarm Hizballah pursuant to UNSCR 1701; and

7           (3) the Lebanese Armed Forces have not co-  
8           operated, coordinated, or partnered with Hizballah  
9           in any operation, campaign, or military exercise dur-  
10          ing the last year.

11          (b) NATIONAL SECURITY WAIVER.—The President  
12          may waive the certification requirements under para-  
13          graphs (1) and (2) of subsection (a) if the President cer-  
14          tifies to Congress that it is in the national security interest  
15          of the United States.
